# **Model County or Municipal Ordinance**

Section 1. Authority.

This ordinance is enacted pursuant to [for cities: NCGS 130A-498 and 160A-174(a); for counties: NCGS 130A-498 and 153A-121(a)].

Section 2. Definitions [Only include definitions for terms that are used in subsequent sections of the ordinance.]

- 1. "<u>City/Town/County</u> building". A building owned, leased as lessor, or the area leased as lessee and occupied by the <u>City/Town/County</u>.
- 2. "<u>City/Town/County</u> vehicle". A passenger-carrying vehicle owned, leased, or otherwise controlled by the <u>City/Town/County</u> and assigned permanently or temporarily to its employees, agencies, institutions, or facilities for official <u>City/Town/County</u> business.
- 3. "E-cigarette". Any electronic oral device that employs a mechanical heating element, battery, or electronic circuit regardless of shape or size and that can be used to heat a liquid nicotine solution or any other substance, and the use or inhalation of which simulates smoking. The term shall include any such device, whether manufactured, distributed, marketed, or sold as an e-cigarette, e-cigar, e-pipe, or under any other product name or descriptor.
- 4.. "Employee". A person who is employed by the <u>City/Town/County</u> of \_\_\_\_\_\_, or who contracts with the <u>City/Town/County</u> or a third person to perform services for the <u>City/Town/County</u>, or who otherwise performs services for the <u>City/Town/County</u> with or without compensation.
- 5. "Grounds". An unenclosed area owned, leased, or occupied by the City/Town/County.
- 6. "Local health department". The district health department, public health authority, or county health department, the jurisdiction of which includes the <u>City/Town/County</u>.
- 7. "<u>City/Town/County</u> parks system". Any tract of land or body of water comprising part of the <u>City/Town/County</u>'s parks, playgrounds, recreation areas, greenways, or trails.

- 7. "Public place". An enclosed area to which the public is invited or permitted.
- 8. "Smoking". The use or possession of a lighted cigarette, lighted cigar, lighted pipe, or any other lighted tobacco product.
- 9. "Tobacco product". Any product containing or derived from tobacco that is intended for human consumption, whether chewed, smoked, absorbed, dissolved, inhaled, or ingested by any other means, including but not limited to cigarettes; e-cigarettes; cigars; little cigars; snuff; and chewing tobacco. A tobacco product excludes any product that has been approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration for sale as a tobacco cessation product, as a tobacco dependence product, or for other medical purposes, and is being marketed and sold solely for such an approved purpose.
- 10. "Universal 'No Smoking' Symbol". Symbol consisting of a pictorial representation of a burning cigarette enclosed in a red circle with a red bar across it.
- 11. "Universal 'No Smoking and Use of Tobacco Products Prohibited' Symbol". Symbol consisting of a pictorial representation of a burning cigarette and a tobacco product enclosed in a red circle with a red bar across it.

Section 3. Areas in Which Smoking and the Use of Tobacco Products are Prohibited

- (a) Smoking and the use of tobacco products are prohibited:
  - 1) In City/Town/County buildings;
  - 2) In City/Town/County vehicles;
  - 3) On City/Town/County grounds;
  - 4) On the grounds of the City/Town/County parks system; and
  - 5) In the <u>City/Town/County</u> buildings located in the <u>City/Town/County</u> park system.
- (b) The prohibition on <u>smoking and the use of tobacco products</u> in the places listed in section (a) above includes those times when they are being used for private events.

Section 4. Areas in Which Smoking and the Use of E-cigarettes are Prohibited

(a) Smoking and the use of e-cigarettes are prohibited:

In all enclosed areas of public places within the <u>City/Town/County</u>, excluding those places identified in NCGS 130A-498(b1) as being exempt from smoking restrictions, including certain tobacco shops, premises of tobacco manufacturers and growers,

- smoking guest rooms in lodging establishments, certain cigar bars, private clubs, and live production sets.
- (b) The prohibition on <u>smoking and the use of e-cigarettes</u> in the places listed in section (a) above includes those times when they are being used for private events.

#### Section 5. Implementation Requirements

- (a) The <u>City/Town/County</u> and <u>persons who manage</u>, operate, or control a <u>public place</u> shall post signs that meet all the requirements in <u>Section 6</u> of this ordinance.
- (b) The <u>City/Town/County</u> and <u>persons who manage</u>, <u>operate</u>, <u>or control a public place</u> shall remove all ashtrays and other smoking receptacles from places where <u>smoking and tobacco products</u> are prohibited, except for ashtrays and receptacles for sale and not intended for use on the premises.
- (c) The person in charge of the <u>City/Town/County building</u>, <u>vehicle</u>, <u>grounds</u>, <u>or parks system or public place</u> or his or her designee, shall direct a person who is <u>smoking or using a tobacco product</u> in a prohibited area to cease and, if the person does not comply, shall contact the <u>City/Town police department/County sheriff department</u> (or specify another appropriate law enforcement agency).

## Section 6. Signage

#### The signs required by Section 5 must:

- (a) State in English (*optional: insert other languages here*) the applicable prohibition for the area (e.g. <u>smoking and the use of tobacco products are prohibited</u>) and include the applicable universal symbol (e.g., <u>the "No Smoking and Use of Tobacco Products</u> Prohibited" symbol).
- (b) Be of sufficient size to be clearly legible to a person of normal vision, and be conspicuously posted.

- (c) Be posted at the entrance to each <u>City/Town/County building</u> and in other locations within the building reasonably calculated to inform employees and the public of the prohibition.
- (d) Be posted in each <u>City/Town/County vehicle</u> in areas visible to passengers, provided that their placement does not interfere with the safe operation of the vehicle. If the vehicle is used for undercover law enforcement operations, a sign is not required to be placed in the vehicle.
- (e) Be posted on <u>City/Town/County grounds</u> in locations and at intervals reasonably calculated to inform employees and the public of the prohibition.
- (f) Be posted at the entrance to buildings in the City/Town/County parks system;
- (g) Be posted on the grounds in the <u>City/Town/County parks system</u> in locations and at intervals reasonably calculated to inform employees and the public of the prohibition.
- (f) Be posted at the entrance to each <u>enclosed public place</u> and in other locations within the enclosed public place reasonably calculated to inform employees and the public of the prohibition.

#### Section 7. Enforcement and Penalties

- (a) Penalty for Violation. Following oral or written notice by the person in charge of an area described in <u>Sections 3 and 4</u>, or his or her designee, failure to cease <u>smoking or using tobacco products</u> constitutes an infraction punishable by a fine of not more than fifty dollars (\$50.00). A citation may be issued by a sworn law enforcement officer. Conviction of an infraction under this section has no consequence other than payment of a penalty, and no court costs may be assessed.
- (b) Additional sanctions for employees. In addition to any penalty under subsection (a), employees of the <u>City/Town/County</u> who violate this ordinance shall be subject to disciplinary action consistent with the City/Town/County's human resources policies.
- (c) (*This subsection should be included only if the ordinance includes a prohibition in public places.*) Violations by persons who manage, operate, or control a public place. A local health director may take the following actions and may impose the following administrative penalty on a person who manages, operates, or controls a public place and fails to comply with the provisions of the ordinance.
  - (1) First violation –Written notice of the person's first violation and notification action to be taken in the event of subsequent violations.
  - (2) Second violation –Written notice of the person's second violation and notification of administrative penalties to be imposed for subsequent violations.
  - (3) Third and subsequent violations –Impose an administrative penalty of not more than two hundred dollars (\$200). Each day on which a violation occurs may be considered a separate and distinct violation.

### Section 8. Public Education

The <u>City/Town/County</u> shall engage in an ongoing program to explain and clarify the purposes and requirements of this ordinance to employees and citizens affected by it and to guide operators and managers in their compliance with it. In doing so, the <u>City/Town/County</u> may rely upon materials and information provided by the local health department.

Section 9. Severability; Conflict of Laws.

If this ordinance or application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the ordinance that can be given separate effect and to that end the provisions of this ordinance are declared to be severable. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 10. Effective Date.
